THE SCHOOL	CURRICULUM	GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS	
<p>Servite High School is a Roman Catholic leadership preparatory school for young men, which welcomes qualified students of all religious, ethnic, and socio-economic backgrounds. The primary mission of Servite High School is the forming of faith-filled leaders.</p> <p>The 15-acre campus, founded in 1958 by the Order of Friar Servants of Mary (Servites), is located in the city of Anaheim, approximately 25 miles south of Los Angeles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">High school population: 80020/1 faculty/student ratio.	<p>All academic courses are college preparatory and are offered in a school year that includes two 18-week semesters. Students are required to attend a minimum of seven academic courses per day every semester except for seniors when 6 are required.</p> <p>We offer 29 Honors Courses in English, Mathematics, Theology, Art History, Laboratory Sciences, History/Social Sciences, Foreign Language, and Computer Science. Admittance to these courses is subject to department approval.</p> <p>We offer 15-20 Advanced Placement Courses depending on enrollment in Art History, U.S. History, World History, European History, U.S. Government, Macroeconomics, English Language, English Literature, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Computer Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Science, Latin Vergil, Mandarin, French, and Spanish Language. PRIORY LEADERSHIP	CHRISTIAN SERVICE	SERVITE GRADING	
<p>The Servite Priory Leadership system gives student leaders more direct responsibility for the operation of the school and makes all students accountable to each other for their performance in academics, activities and discipline. It is modeled in structure after the world-wide governing structure of the Servite Order of priests and brothers, and emphasizes Servite values like collegiality in decision-making. One or two class sessions ("Priory Periods") are scheduled each week so student leaders can practice leadership in a real-world setting.</p> <p>The school is run by an executive team of students collectively called the Generalate. The student <i>Prior General</i> is the CEO with overall responsibility for performance of the Priors. The other three executive positions include the <i>Vicar General</i> (chief operations officer), <i>Secretary General</i> (chief communications officer) and the <i>Treasurer General</i> (chief logistics officer). All students on campus are members of one of eight <i>Priories</i> of about 120 students each. Each Priory is led by a student <i>Prior</i> who is responsible for all students within his Priory. Each Priory is further divided into five <i>Homerrooms</i> of about 18-20 students led by an <i>Assistant Prior</i>.</p>	<p>It is important that Christian service hours come from different sources. 100 total hours required for graduation</p> <p>As part of our commitment to service the students can participate in and lead through a weekly outreach called Her Servants' Kitchen. Each Thursday - in the Servite tradition of service to others - the young men bag food, prepare dinner and serve it to a community of homeless men and women who live in and around La Palma Park in Anaheim. This student led ministry has never missed a Thursday and to date, has served more than 13,000 meals.</p>	All courses offered at Servite High School are designed for the college and university-bound student. For graduation from Servite High School, all students are required to complete 270 academic credits. A one-year course meeting daily earns a student ten (10) academic credits. All required courses in all disciplines must be passed (D-) and no student may graduate from Servite with an unredeemed 'F' on his transcript . Servite High School are computed on a 4 point scale and issues letter grades with plusses and minuses based on the following rubric: Servite High School does not rank.

<p>Trinity Corporation is the student leadership, for-profit model corporation that is led by a student CEO, four Vice Presidents, and twenty student managers, that includes over 300 student employees in the Work Study Program. Trinity Corporation is responsible for all retail sales, online sales, marketing, advertising, food services and catering with an annual income budget of over one million dollars. All profits go to financial aid to benefit student interns.</p> <p>Trinity Corporation provides student leaders with real-life work experiences in retail operations, food services, human resources and facilities support. Students have a shared mission of raising funds to provide financial aid to their Servite brothers who otherwise would not be able to attend Servite... brothers helping brothers.</p>	<p>Servite High School's Sanberg International Leadership Program is for honors students with initial focus on leadership theory currently related to China. The SILP is unique in scope and offers, through our Mandarin Foreign Language course requirement, an immersion experience second to none in any high school setting (involving language, cultural and Leadership Theory). The program is named for the founder and alumnus, Joseph Sanberg, valedictorian and former Vice President for the Class of 1997. The program consists of three components: A Servite classroom experience that explores Leadership Theory in the fall. During the spring, a Chinese language and cultural exploration. This culminates with a merit-based travel experience for qualified students during the summer following their sophomore and junior years.</p>

ATHLETICS

Athletics are an integral part of the high school experience at Servite. Approximately 78% of our students participate in one or more of our 13 CIF team sports and 2 club sports. Servite's rigorous academic standards coupled with our competitive athletic programs have resulted in college scholarships for Servite athletes to Division I, II and III schools including USC, UCLA, MIT, Penn, Notre Dame, Oregon, Columbia, and BYU just to name a few.

Servite continues to compete in the Trinity League, one of the toughest leagues in the nation. To date, the Friars have won 140 League Championships and have produced many individual champions in league, CIF and State competition. The CIF Southern Section has also named Servite a "Champion for Character School," citing the schools example of sportsmanship, character, integrity and athletics.
