SERVITE PROGRAM OF STUDIES

All courses offered at Servite High School are designed for the college and university-bound student. For graduation from Servite High School, all students are required to complete 270 academic credits. A one-year course meeting daily earns a student ten (10) academic credits. All of the courses must be passed and no student may graduate from Servite with an unredeemed 'F' for a semester grade on his transcript.

EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY & TEXTBOOKS

What is the Servite Technology Program?

As citizens of a global society, the graduates of Servite will understand and apply the appropriate use of technology to be Faith-Filled leaders and innovators.

The Servite High School Technology Program provides students the freedom to learn and master academic content through personalized instruction; form students' moral and ethical understanding and application of technology, and prepare students to meet the ever-changing technological demands relevant to higher education and the workplace.

Technology planning activities and budget decisions will reflect a long-range strategic focus. To the greatest extent possible, decisions will be made with an eye to the future and with an understanding that technology is only one component in achieving the school's mission. Furthermore, Servite High School will not "adopt" a technology program; instead, Servite High School will "adapt" its technology program to authentically emulate real-world applications and technology advancement.

What device does the school issue the students?

Each freshman will receive a new laptop computer, which will be hand imaged with all necessary operating system, software, and security. This device will be entrusted to his care for his duration at Servite High School. The laptop will be under warranty for four years. Aside from intentional or accidental damage, most repairs are fully covered and will not incur any additional fees.

What is included in the Technology Fee?

This fee includes the use of a laptop computer and carrying case, imaging, and access to all online textbooks, interactive software, online resources, internet access, Microsoft Office and applicable curriculum. These resources include Parent and Student Aeries Gradebook Portal Access, Google Classroom, Turnitin.com, and Grammarly.

What training do you provide the students?

Each incoming freshman will be required to take a computer applications class that covers the tech skills and programs necessary to be successful at Servite, as well as a comprehensive internet safety curriculum. Also, all freshmen will have a laptop/technology orientation at the beginning of the school year to review essential care, protocols, and login information. All international and transfer students will be required to attend a technology orientation. FORMATION

What is Servite Formation?

Formation is the intentional, systematic direction of the complete student experience toward a development of the whole, unique person--body and soul. The entire process is centered on one insistent question: "Who are you?" Formation focuses on the development of character and virtue inviting each student to become the man they have been called by God to be.

Who is responsible for the formation of each student?

Alongside the primary influence of the parents, Servite Formation calls on faculty, coaches, staff, and alumni to fulfill each one's unique, pivotal role in the Formation process. Formation is most effective when all members of the community model a common mission to challenge the will toward truth and encourage the development of the entire person.

It is the expectation of Formation that each student's experience of every aspect of his life – home life, the classroom, athletics, arts, and friends – shapes him in the same consistent way. Whether it be through participation on an athletic team, retreats, a math class or campus clubs, the Servite student continually encounters and interacts with the Formation process, specifically through the Formation Themes.

What are the Formation Themes?

A student's experience will be far more valuable if he is given a structure through which he is able to frame any situation, endeavor, or challenge that life presents. The following themes are intended to provide that structure in any context, both on and off campus. They are not listed in order of importance; rather, each overlaps and must be interdependent with the others to be fully realized.

PRIMACY OF FAITH

Life's greatest and most important truths cannot be discovered by reason alone. We must accept that mystery exists and that life is a series of acts of faith, large and small. The most elemental act of faith is the belief that we possess a fundamental uniqueness that makes us who we are - unlike anyone else, past, present, or future.

MASTERY OF SELF

The gifts that make us who we are reveal the unique vocation we have been given by God. By mastering ourselves and developing our gifts, we will make the world a better place in a way that no one else ever can. This is the fundamental responsibility that gives meaning and purpose to our lives.

NECESSITY OF THE OTHER

An honest assessment of who we are reveals that we have limits and need others. Properly developing ourselves requires that we properly develop all the relationships that make us who we are.

CENTRALITY OF CHRIST

There is one "other" we can never do without. God made us who we are and Christ brought us direct contact with God. Therefore, everything we do should be under Christ's direction and modeled after him. We should note especially that Christ's fundamental teaching is love as defined by mercy. This should be the measure of all our relationships.

Formation Conclusion

The single most important element in the success of Servite Formation is a comprehensive campus climate that exposes each student to the person of Christ, drawing them to embrace Christ, love Christ, imitate Christ, live Christ, be Christ, so as to draw others to Christ.

CAMPUS MINISTRY

Campus Ministry Mission Statement

The Department of Campus Ministry promulgates and seeks to fulfill the mission of Servite High School.

We offer activities and programs to the school community that awaken faith and promote the values of fraternity, service, hospitality, and compassion as embodied in the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church and the Order of Friar Servants of Mary.

We foster the search for God and develop a masculine spirituality through personal encounters with Christ.

We achieve our mission through daily prayer, liturgical worship, the celebration of the Sacraments, days of reflection, retreats, related spiritual leadership opportunities, spiritual direction, and Christian Service.

The Order of Friar Servants of Mary

The spiritual life and identity of Servite High School are founded on the principles and traditions of the Servite Order. Founded in 1233, the Servite Order extends its traditions of service, fraternity, and devotion to Mary, to the men of Servite High School.

Theology Classes

All students attend a daily class in Catholic Theology. In this setting, students are challenged to examine and study the teachings and traditions of the Catholic Church with an academic approach.

- Freshmen: Encountering Christ, the Word
- Sophomore: The Mission of Christ
- Juniors: Life in Christ
- Seniors: Critical Reflections

Liturgy

Liturgical life is an important part of the spiritual formation available at Servite. In our worship, we honor and give worth to God.

School Prayer

Each day includes Morning Prayer, the Angelus (before lunch), and Closing Prayer. We ask God's blessings upon our work and ourselves.

All-School Mass

The entire school attends Mass at least once a month on selected feasts of the Church and/or Servite Order. Professional Dress is worn for All-School Masses.

Reconciliation Services

Each Advent and Lent, a communal Reconciliation service with individual confessions is scheduled for the whole school.

Prayer Services

Liturgical Prayer services and praise celebrations are scheduled for Thanksgiving and Easter.

Parent Outreach

Parent outreach consists of Masses, day retreats, and fellowship opportunities for mothers and fathers.

KAIROS

The culmination of the Servite Retreat Program is the KAIROS Retreat. This off-campus, overnight program for juniors and seniors is an intense experience that combines theological input, prayer, liturgy, spiritual reflection, and interpersonal encounters.

Christian Service

Each Servite student completes and documents a minimum of one hundred (100) hours of Christian Service as a component of his graduation requirements. These activities should be chosen to benefit the civic community, church, and our school community. Christian Service education includes the following: A freshman assembly to introduce the program, local resources and service opportunities, reflection on Gospel teachings about service and written exercises which apply church teachings to the experience of serving others. Excursion opportunities to sites of ministry will be periodically offered. These hours will count towards their service hour requirement for graduation.

PRIORY LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

What is the Servite Priory Leadership Program?

The Priory Leadership Program, inspired by the tradition of the Servite Order, is a comprehensive, hands-on leadership experience intended to give the men of Servite the opportunity to practice community-based leadership and followership. This is accomplished through a variety of activities that move students toward growth as Servite Friars - growth in fraternity, service, and Marian devotion - and allow for a deeper understanding of who they are and how they are being called to lead.

What are the purposes of the Priory Leadership Program?

The fundamental weakness of most student leadership development programs is their lack of real leadership experience. Real leadership only exists when there is tangible responsibility and direct accountability for other people. With that in mind, there are four fundamental purposes of the Priory Leadership Program:

- Increased responsibility
- Peer accountability
- Critical understanding of leadership theory
- Hands-on leadership experience

By giving students significant responsibility in the operation of the school and direct accountability for their peers, students will gain the real experience that is required to successfully develop as the kind of leaders prepared to make a difference in their schools, churches, businesses, families, communities, and beyond.

How does the Priory Leadership Program work?

The Priory Leadership Program encompasses the entire student body. Students are divided into eight Priories (a Servite word for a community). Each Priory is comprised of 105-110 students (freshmen through seniors). The Priories are named after the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order with the addition of "Philip," one of the primary Servite saints:

- Alexis
- Amideus
- Bonajuncta (pronounced "bōnăyūnctă")
- Bonfilius
- Hugh
- Manettus
- Philip
- Sostene (pronounced "sōstīnay")

Each Priory is led by a combination of Priors and Assistant Priors. The Priors and their Assistant Priors are expected to not only lead their Priory through a variety of activities and competitions with the other Priories, but also to uphold and enforce standards regarding moral discipline, academic performance, and leadership. Each Priory is further divided into several homerooms. Under the direction of the Prior, the Assistant Priors not only plan but also implement their Priory's goals and objectives within their homerooms. While the work of the Priors and Assistant Priors is continuous, the primary means of implementation of Priory activities is through the Priory Period which occurs weekly. Faculty/Staff Proctors are present within each homeroom for the purpose of guidance/mentoring and supervision, while the plan and its implementation for each period is left entirely in the hands of the Prior and his Assistant Priors.

The management of the entire Priory System is overseen by the Prior General and the other members of the Generalate - the Vicar General, Secretary General, and Treasurer General. The Generalate, in consultation with the Principal and Director of Leadership Development, determines the specific directives for the Priories each year. The Generalate is seen by the school administration as the primary representatives of the student body and is often consulted on a variety of school matters, large and small.

How is the Priory Leadership Program different from the traditional ASB model of student leadership?

The traditional ASB model is typically activity-based. Student leaders execute tasks related to the implementation of campus programs that are in large part pre-packaged (most are annual events, school dances, pep rallies, fundraisers, etc.). Beyond a setlist of activities, typical student leaders have limited responsibility for campus life and, similarly, have very little accountability for the behavior of their peers. The Servite Priory Leadership Program gives student leaders much greater responsibility for the operation of the school and makes all students accountable to each other for their performance in all areas of campus life.

HER SERVANTS' CLOSET

What is Her Servants' Closet?

Her Servants' Closet (HSC) is a student-run service organization with a mission to provide Servite students in need with a way to obtain uniforms at either a lower cost or no cost. Servite families donate unneeded and outgrown uniforms, giving these uniforms a second life with another Servite student. To preserve privacy, families receiving tuition assistance are offered individual appointments to "shop" Her Servants' Closet for needed items. Information will be provided to students who receive tuition assistance about how to schedule an appointment later this spring. Questions may be directed to hsc@servitehs.org.

FOOD SERVICES

Servite offers full food service through our on-site kitchen beginning at 7 AM on school days for breakfast, followed by break and lunch. Our food services are managed by Bevaris Alliance, a premier regional food services provider for schools, and they provide a wide variety of food choices each day at a range of prices. Bevaris Alliance does offer various payment methods for food purchases including cashless payments via Servite student ID cards. TUITION INFORMATION AND PAYMENT PLANS

At Servite, our goal is to provide students with the best education possible while trying to keep the cost of tuition & fees down. The following is a summary of the tuition and payment information. For additional information, please visit the Tuition Information page found in the Business Office section of the Servite website at servitehs.org.

2021-22 Tuition, Discounts & Fees

TUITION - \$18,015.00

The annual cost to attend Servite includes: Student I.D. and loadable meal card, yearbook, on-line student newspaper, guidance and counseling services, locker, report cards, student activity insurance, standardized testing, Servite school calendars, Kairos, strength and conditioning training, and facility upgrades.

TUITION DISCOUNTS

Families may be eligible to receive tuition discounts which are deducted from the total annual tuition amount. The following are the different discounts available. These discounts will automatically be applied to your tuition amount on your contract if you qualify.

REGISTERED CATHOLIC DISCOUNT - \$1,000

The Catholic discount is mandated by the Bishop of the Diocese of Orange and is only available to students who are practicing Catholics who participate in sacramental life, parish activities, and whose families contribute financially to their parish. We must receive a completed Parish Verification form from your parish stating that you fulfill the above criteria.

ANNUAL PAYMENT DISCOUNT - \$500

Servite offers an annual payment tuition discount to families who pay tuition annually on or before May 15, 2021 through your AutoPay account via eCheck, debit card or credit card. All payments made with debit card or credit card will be subject to a 2.85% convenience fee. Families that are awarded financial aid may also receive the annual payment discount. However, it is subject to proration based on the percentage of actual tuition being paid to net tuition (full tuition less applicable discounts).

BROTHER DISCOUNT - \$200 PER STUDENT

Only applied when 2 or more brothers are enrolled at Servite for the 2021-2022 school year. Each student account is given the discount.

Tuition Payments

Payments scheduled through our billing site via AutoPay are made by automatic bank withdrawal (ACH/EFT). School personnel will not have access to your financial account outside of the parameters of this agreement, and all account information will be kept confidential. To sign up for AutoPay you must enter your Enrollment Portal. Automatic tuition payment set-up must be completed on-line by May 15, 2021. You will need the following information to set up your AutoPay account:

- Bank log-in information or bank account and routing number of your checking or savings account or your credit or debit card number. We accept all credit card types. Please understand that an additional 2.85% convenience fee will be charged if payments are made using a credit or debit card.

HOW TO SET UP YOUR AUTOPAY ACCOUNT:

- All parents must use the AutoPay function on your family's Enrollment Portal to set up an account.
- AutoPay will begin tuition payment deductions on July 5th.
- There is a \$20 or \$40 annual processing fee that will be charged to your account upon set-up. This fee is based upon your chosen payment plan (semi-annual or monthly). Annual payment plans will not be assessed with a processing fee.
- If you are a Financial Aid recipient, payment plans will be adjusted once financial aid amounts is awarded.

Fees

REGISTRATION FEE

- \$595 on or before April 15, 2021 (non-refundable)
- \$645 after April 15, 2021 (non-refundable)

A non-refundable registration fee of \$595 is required from all accepted incoming freshmen students. This payment should have been made to the Servite Admissions Office upon acceptance. If not submitted, Servite may consider the student as choosing to not attend.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

- \$900 (Computer Fee \$300 and E-Books \$600) on or before May 15, 2021
- \$950 (Computer Fee \$325 and E-Books \$625) if paid after May 15, 2021

Servite's Technology Fee covers the use of a laptop computer, carrying case, on-campus technical support, internet bandwidth, network equipment maintenance and upgrades, and other applications including, but not limited to: Naviance, Turnitin.com, student email, and access to some online ebook/e-resources. Students using online books may also elect to purchase traditional textbooks at their own expense. For more information, please see the textbook list published in June 2021, on the Servite website.

FACILITY FEE

- \$495 on or before May 15, 2021
- \$545 if paid after May 15, 2021

The facility fee helps offset capital expenditures for classrooms, grounds and common areas of the campus. It also helps offset the cost of Campus Ministry, Formation and the Priory Leadership programs.

SPORTS AND ACTIVITIES FEES

Sports, clubs and activities may charge additional fees and may have fundraising requirements for student participation which are not included in the school tuition or fees.

LATE FEES

Servite will charge a \$25 fee for any delinquent or returned payments

Payment & Refund Policies

TUITION & FEE NON-PAYMENT POLICY

If tuition and/or fees are not paid at the end of the previous semester or school year and no payment plan has been established, the student will be denied admission the following year. Quarter and/or semester grade reports will be withheld, and the student will be denied participation in sports and/or school activities until the account is current or a payment plan has been established. Accounts showing continued delinquency or nonpayment may be turned over to a collection agency and the student will be removed from Servite.

TUITION REFUND POLICY

Tuition paid will be refunded at 100% if a student is withdrawn on or before August 1, 2021. If a student is withdrawn after August 1, 2021, please visit our website under the Business Office tab, Tuition Information, for the current refund schedule. If you are making tuition payments according to a payment plan, the parents or guardians who are financially responsible for the student are obligated to pay tuition and fees according to the published refund schedule.

If your son leaves the school before the end of the school year, you are still obligated to pay the prorated amount indicated in the published refund schedule regardless of the reason for leaving - whether initiated by the family or the school.

PAYMENT PLANS

Servite offers families the option to pay tuition annually, semi-annually or monthly. All payment options must be processed through AutoPay. You can sign-up for AutoPay upon completion of your contract or through your family's Enrollment Portal. AutoPay must be completed on-line by May 15, 2021.

ANNUAL PAYMENT PLAN

Servite offers discounts to families who make their annual tuition payment in full by May 15, 2021.

- Full tuition and fees made on or before May 15, 2021 will receive a \$500 discount (prorated for financial aid families). Please note: Your entire obligation (i.e. tuition & school fees) for the 2021-22 school year must be paid by May 15, 2021 in order to receive the annual payment discount.
- Credit Card and Debit Card payments are subject to a 2.85% convenience fee.
- Payments should be made online through the Enrollment Portal billing system.
- Pay in full discount will be prorated based on the ratio of net tuition due divided by discounted tuition cost. Therefore, if you are receiving financial aid, and choose to pay in full, the pay in full discount is subject to proration as described above.

SEMI-ANNUAL PAYMENT PLAN

Tuition for the school year is divided into two payments.

- Semi-annual tuition payment plan allows parents to pay tuition on July 5, 2021 and January 5, 2022.
- If this option is selected, a \$20 processing fee will be charged after your account set-up.

MONTHLY PAYMENT PLAN

The monthly payment plan allows tuition payments to be distributed over ten (10), eleven (11), or twelve (12) months for Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors and ten (10) months for Seniors.

- Tuition payments will be withdrawn on the 5th of each month unless other arrangements have been made through the Business Office.
- Your first tuition payment must be paid on July 5, 2021.
- If this option is selected, a \$40 processing fee will be charged upon the completion of your contract.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Servite's clubs and activities are testimony that our young Friars are passionate about an expansive list of topics. These groups offer Servite students the opportunity to collaborate with their brothers on their many different passions. Club Rush is held in the Fall to give students an opportunity to sign up for clubs that interest them. Visit servitehs.org/clubs for more information. Below is a sample of the many club offerings.

Clubs

ACADEMIC DECATHLON Academic Decathlon is a rigorous, challenging extracurricular activity that prepares a team of students to compete in ten academic subjects against other teams in Orange County. Teams consist of students from all GPA levels. This club is not for the academically faint-hearted! It is guaranteed to enrich and intellectually strengthen all who dare to participate.

CALIFORNIA SCHOLARSHIP FEDERATION This club promotes academic recognition of the Servite Scholar and peer assistance to other members and students. Students are given recognition at graduation based upon the number of semesters of active club membership. Applicants must maintain a 3.5 GPA for the previous semester and reapply each semester. Activities include peer tutoring, community partnership with elementary schools and community service projects.

CLASSICAL LANGUAGE AND HISTORY SOCIETY This club will discuss classical literature, history and philosophy of the classical period.

FILIPINO CULTURAL CLUB The Filipino Cultural Club seeks to celebrate, promote and increase awareness of Filipino culture to the Servite community. We openly accept all cultures and ethnicities that desire to learn about the Philippines.

FILM CLUB This club will show films which encourage conversation in a social setting. Film club is open to all grade levels.

HOCKEY CLUB Servite Ice Hockey Club Team allows hockey players who attend Servite High School this opportunity to represent their school while playing the sport that they love. The team is open to all grade levels.

INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN SOCIETY The International Thespian Society is an Honor Society for students involved in Theatre Arts. Meetings are held after school once a month. Thespians attend the California State and International Festivals annually. There is also a Junior Thespian Division which includes junior high students from local schools.

INVESTMENT CLUB The purpose of this club is to introduce students to the basics of investing, how the stock market works, how to research investments and develop investment criteria.

JUNIOR STATESMEN OF AMERICA Junior Statesmen of America is a non-partisan political club which devotes its time to area conferences, on-campus guest speakers, one-day seminars, and weekend conventions. Students have exposure to politics and may attend summer schools at Stanford, Yale, Georgetown, and others, as well as symposiums in Los Angeles and Sacramento. Elected officers and positions are available in the State and Region.

KEY CLUB This group is comprised of students from all grade levels. Key Club is sponsored by Kiwanis International, donates its time and energy to community service projects throughout Orange County.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY The NHS Chapter at Servite High School serves to honor students who have demonstrated excellence in areas of scholarship, leadership, service and character. Membership challenges students to develop themselves through active involvement in school activities and community service. Students must be cooperative, demonstrate high standards of honesty and reliability, show courtesy, concern, respect for others, and generally maintain a good, clean healthy lifestyle.

POWERSPORTS This club will meet to educate and form a community on campus focused on power sports and the automotive industry.

RED CROSS The Red Cross club meets monthly to plan and execute service projects determined by student leaders of the club. The Red Cross Blood Drive is one of the main service projects which the students support.

ROBOTICS CLUB Students on the robotics team plan, design, build, and program a robot that will compete against other school's robots at a regional competition in a fun-filled collaborative and competitive atmosphere. In addition to real, hands-on, technical engineering training, students also develop skills in collaboration, communication, planning, fundraising, public relations, and more.

SACRED MUSIC CLUB This club allows students to share music with each other and discuss popular bands and artists.

SERVITE ESPORTS This club promotes student opportunities to compete in gaming at a varsity level while being surrounded by peers and supported by teachers. Servite Esports integrates the charisms of the Servite Order as well as the formation themes of the school in order to teach the students how to live virtuously and integrate technology into a well ordered Christian life.

SERVITE MEDICAL DEVICE CLUB The purpose of this club is to build or design a medical device that may potentially help the community with its physical or medical needs.

SERVITE RUGBY The purpose is to form faith-filled leaders by developing athletes' intellect and will through the Rugby experience.

SPANISH CLUB The club focuses on teaching and exposing students to the culture, food and traditions of different Spanish speaking countries. The club also offers tutoring for the currently enrolled Spanish students.

SPORTS MEDICINE CLUB This club introduces its student members to the medical field by extending the Biology curriculum.

TABLE TENNIS CLUB The purpose of this club is to increase school spirit and provide a social outlet for students to gather as a community to play table tennis.

WE RISE TOGETHER This selfless club will devote its time and efforts into helping and supporting children in foster care. The main goal is to be of service to foster children in their educational, financial, emotional, spiritual and mental health.

Dance Policies

Servite is a Catholic high school rooted in the traditions of the Order Friar Servants of Mary. All young men and women attending school events are expected to treat these traditions and Servite High School with respect. This includes respecting one's self by dressing appropriately at all functions. Please read and be mindful of the rules posted below. These rules have been developed by the Servite High School community and represent the Servite Charism.

- Modest dress according to Catholic Christian values will be enforced.
- All students are required to bring a high school ID. NO ID, NO ADMITTANCE!
- A Dance Pass must be filled out before entering formal dances OR bringing guests to any dance.
- Servite students are responsible for the actions of their guests.
- Anything "gang" related or associated is prohibited!

HEADWEAR

All headwear is prohibited unless otherwise noted. This includes but is not limited to knit caps, hair nets, hats, and bandanas.

OUTERWEAR

All outerwear must be size appropriate. Therefore, it cannot be too big, too small, too baggy or too tight.

DRESS CODE

Modest dress consistent with Catholic Christian values will be enforced. Servite students are responsible for notifying their guests of the appropriate dress code for the dance.

- Pants: must not be more than one inch larger than a student's actual waist size and cannot drag on the ground. Pants cannot be altered to prevent "draggy, saggy and baggy". Pants with holes or an inseam or outer seam cut from the bottom of the cuff are prohibited. Sweatsuits and pajama bottoms are prohibited.
- Shorts: cannot hang any lower than one inch below the knee.
- Shirts: must have a collar, cannot be torn and must not contain offensive or inappropriate logos, words or drawings.
- Shoes: Tennis or sports shoes must be worn at all times. Shoes must have a soft rubber sole with a closed back and toe.

STUDENTS ATTENDING SERVITE DANCES ARE NOT PERMITTED TO:

- Leave the dance early without notification from parents or go off campus at anytime during the dance
- Linger at their cars before the dance
- Go to their cars during a dance unless accompanied by a school chaperone
- Engage in mosh or freak style dancing
- Bring to the dance, or use at a dance, GLOW materials
- Smoke, vape, consume alcoholic beverages or use any other harmful substances

Students are expected to arrive and depart on time. All parents must pick up their sons or daughters no later than 15 minutes after the end of a dance. All school rules apply at Servite dances, whether held on or off campus. Servite High School reserves the right to determine what is appropriate behavior and dress. Students who are asked to leave a dance may not attend the next school dance.

ATHLETICS: QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

Servite Athletics helps develop faith-filled leaders. Our student-athletes are challenged to make good decisions and to perform as part of a team, all while giving 100% both on and off the field. Members of the athletic staff, coaches, strength coaches and athletic trainers work in conjunction with teachers and administrators to help athletes develop good sportsmanship, teamwork and ethical conduct.

Due to our current health climate, the Servite Sports Medicine department has cancelled our On-Campus Sports Physicals Day. In order to provide our families with another option, we are proud to announce that we have partnered with Marque Medical - Buena Park to ease the process of obtaining a Sports Physical during this challenging situation.

While families can certainly see whomever they feel most comfortable with, going to Marque Medical provides some advantages for our athletes. In addition to getting your son in quickly, Marque Medical has agreed to donate a portion of the proceeds back to Servite's Athletic Department. The cost of the physical is \$50, due at the time of visit.

IMPORTANT

If you choose to complete physicals elsewhere, they must be completed and turned in prior to the first day of summer practice or your son will not be allowed to participate. Please verify that the physical is dated on or after May 1, 2021. This will ensure that your athlete is at least covered until the next Servite Physical Day is offered in May 2021.

The Servite Athletics Department can only accept physicals completed by an MD, DO, NP, or PA under the supervision of an MD or DO. Physical forms must also be stamped to be considered valid. If a physical does not meet these requirements it will be returned to the athlete. The Servite physical form can be found at servitehs.org/athletics/forms-information.

It also gives a nod to “3”, as Tri-School Theatre’s history and students will never be forgotten, but instead remain part of our rich history and our program’s future.



Mission Statement

Building on the legacy of Tri-School Theatre, and striving to focus on the student personally, artistically, and spiritually, Trinitas Arts Conservatory (TAC) is an educational Theatre ministry dedicated to arts advocacy in the greater community, nurturing both the artist and the individual, and developing our students’ God-given talents through process-oriented training in a Christ-centered environment.

Philosophy

Through the philosophical, financial, and educational commitment of the administrations of Rosary Academy and Servite High School, Trinitas Arts Conservatory is a model of cooperation and support for the value of arts in education. TAC is committed to nurturing the individual gifts of each student in a community that recognizes that an individual’s talents are a gift from God and are to be shared with others in a spirit of gratitude. Although Trinitas Arts Conservatory strives to maintain the highest standards for performance and production quality, the focus is on the process of educating the student. While studying the skills of acting, musical theatre, movement, vocal technique, improvisation, playwriting, directing, and stagecraft, Trinitas Arts Conservatory students learn life skills such as critical thinking, leadership, and responsibility through discovery, collaboration, and affirmation in a process-oriented, Christ-centered environment.

Overview and Activities

MAINSTAGE PRODUCTIONS

We produce three shows a year, which allow students to participate in a variety of productions as cast or crew members. Freshmen are welcome in all productions.

CONSERVATORY CLASSES

Students may enroll in our Conservatory program which meets on select Thursdays at Servite. We offer year-long classes in Acting and Tech, as well as a number of electives throughout our Fall, Winter, and Spring sessions (Musical Theatre, Stage Management, Dance, Monologues, Make-Up, Costume Design, Cabaret, and Musical Theatre Scene Studies). Our year-long classes offer a comprehensive educational program and students who choose to, may advance from Acting I/ Beginning Tech to Acting II/Intermediate Tech and Acting III/IV/ Advanced Tech over the course of four years.

INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN FESTIVAL

The International Thespian Society is the only organization to honor secondary school students for outstanding work in theatre. Trinitas Arts Conservatory participates in the International Thespian Society through our Troupe 4566. Students become members by earning points for their work. Upon graduation, eligible Thespians are awarded honor cords to wear at graduation ceremonies.

Each year, we attend the **CALIFORNIA STATE THESPIAN FESTIVAL**. Students from all over the state come together to share their love of theatre. The weekend includes workshops, Thespy (Individual Events) auditions, auditioning for **PLAYWORKS** and both the Opening and Closing numbers. Tech students are encouraged to interview for crew positions as well.

The **INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN FESTIVAL** is held annually in Bloomington, Indiana in June. Without a doubt, it is one of the greatest experiences you can have while in high school. Thespians attend over 15 mainstage productions over the course of six days! Thespians stay in dorms and attend workshops, perform in the play marathon or Playworks, and have the opportunity to bond with other students from around the world. Additionally, some of the nation's top theatre colleges hold auditions for juniors which offers opportunities for scholarships and early acceptance.

COMEDY SPORTZ: HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

For students with comedic aspirations or an overactive funny bone, the Comedy Sportz: High School League Team is open for people who think they are funny or want to be funny—we'll teach you! The team "competes" in performances of improvisational games learned at practices, and it's fun for all! This non-competitive performance emphasizes ensemble and confidence. Our matches are on select Fridays at Servite. Team practices are held on Fridays throughout the year. Freshmen are welcome on the team.

ADVANCEMENT OFFICE

The generosity and dedication of Servite's community of parents, alumni, faculty, coaches and friends has been instrumental in establishing the school as one of the nation's leading Catholic high schools for young men. As a private school, Servite receives no government support and relies on tuition, endowment earnings and donations to cover operating expenses.

The Advancement Office is responsible for cultivating support for the school's operating and capital needs. Fundraising efforts are coordinated by our department and focus on three critical areas:

Annual Fund

The Annual Fund helps pay for the Formation program, classroom equipment and technology, faculty professional development opportunities, and financial aid programs. It helps Servite attract and retain a talented and committed faculty and provides support for extracurricular activities, clubs, and arts initiatives as well as other programs. Like other private schools, tuition does not cover the full cost of a Servite education. We rely on the generosity of our community to help provide the "Servite Difference."

Capital Campaign

The Capital Campaign is an ambitious, multi-year effort to develop new national-caliber facilities. Projects have included updating the outdoor dining area, Grotto and Alumni Garden, Aquatics Center, and Multi-Sports Complex/Baseball Field.
